**The First Lesson: Isaiah 6:1-8 (CSB)**

<sup>1</sup> In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a high and lofty throne, and the hem of his robe filled the temple.

<sup>2</sup> Seraphim were standing above him; they each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, with two they covered their

feet, and with two they flew. <sup>3</sup> And one called to another: Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of Armies; his glory fills the whole earth. <sup>4</sup> The foundations of the doorways shook at the sound of their voices, and the temple was filled with smoke. <sup>5</sup> Then I said: Woe is me for I am ruined because I am a man of unclean lips and live among a people of unclean lips, and because my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of Armies. <sup>6</sup> Then one of the seraphim flew to me, and in his hand was a glowing coal that he had taken from the altar with tongs. <sup>7</sup> He touched my mouth with it and said: Now that this has touched your lips, your iniquity is removed and your sin is atoned for. <sup>8</sup> Then I heard the voice of the Lord asking: Who will I send? Who will go for us? I said: Here I am. Send me.

### **The Second Lesson: Acts 2:22-36 (CSB)**

<sup>22</sup> “Fellow Israelites, listen to these words: This Jesus of Nazareth was a man attested to you by God with miracles, wonders, and signs that God did among you through him, just as you yourselves know. <sup>23</sup> Though he was delivered up according to God’s determined plan and foreknowledge, you used lawless people to nail him to a cross and kill him. <sup>24</sup> God raised him up, ending the pains of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by death. <sup>25</sup> For David says of him:

I saw the Lord ever before me;  
because he is at my right hand,  
I will not be shaken.

<sup>26</sup> Therefore my heart is glad  
and my tongue rejoices.

Moreover, my flesh will rest in hope,  
<sup>27</sup> because you will not abandon me in Hades  
or allow your holy one to see decay.

<sup>28</sup> You have revealed the paths of life to me;  
you will fill me with gladness  
in your presence.

<sup>29</sup> “Brothers and sisters, I can confidently speak to you about the patriarch David: He is both dead and buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. <sup>30</sup> Since he was a prophet, he knew that God had sworn an oath to him to seat one of his descendants on his throne. <sup>31</sup> Seeing what was to come, he spoke concerning the resurrection of the Messiah: He was not abandoned in Hades, and his flesh did not experience decay. <sup>32</sup> “God has raised this Jesus; we are all witnesses of this. <sup>33</sup> Therefore, since he has been exalted to the right hand of God and has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit, he has poured out what you both see and hear. <sup>34</sup> For it was not David who ascended into the heavens, but he himself says: The Lord declared to my Lord, ‘Sit at my right hand <sup>35</sup> until I make your enemies your footstool.’ <sup>36</sup> “Therefore let all the house of Israel know with certainty that God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah.”

**The Gospel Lesson: John 3:31-36 (CSB)**

**Pastor:** The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 3rd chapter.

**Congregation:** Glory to You, O Lord!

<sup>31</sup> The one who comes from above is above all. The one who is from the earth is earthly and speaks in earthly terms. The one who comes from heaven is above all. <sup>32</sup> He testifies to what he has seen and heard, and yet no one accepts his testimony.

<sup>33</sup> The one who has accepted his testimony has affirmed that God is true. <sup>34</sup> For the one whom God sent speaks God’s words, since he gives the Spirit without measure. <sup>35</sup> The Father loves the Son and has given all things into his hands. <sup>36</sup> The one who

believes in the Son has eternal life, but the one who rejects the Son will not see life; instead, the wrath of God remains on him.
