The First Reading: Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31

¹ Does not wisdom call out? Does not understanding raise her voice? ² At the highest point along the way, where the paths meet, she takes her stand; ³ beside the gate leading into the city, at the entrance, she cries aloud: ⁴ “To you, O people, I call out; I raise my voice to all mankind.

²² “The LORD brought me forth as the first of his works, before his deeds of old; ²³ I was formed long ages ago, at the very beginning, when the world came to be. ²⁴ When there were no watery depths, I was given birth, when there were no springs overflowing with

water;²⁵ before the mountains were settled in place, before the hills, I was given birth,²⁶ before he made the world or its fields or any of the dust of the earth.²⁷ I was there when he set the heavens in place, when he marked out the horizon on the face of the deep,²⁸ when he established the clouds above and fixed securely the fountains of the deep,²⁹ when he gave the sea its boundary so the waters would not overstep his command, and when he marked out the foundations of the earth.³⁰ Then I was constantly at his side. I was filled with delight day after day, rejoicing always in his presence,³¹ rejoicing in his whole world and delighting in mankind.

Congregation: Thanks be to God!

The Second Reading: Romans 5:1-9

¹ Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,² through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God.³ Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance;⁴ perseverance, character; and character, hope.⁵ And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.⁶ You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly.⁷ Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die.⁸ But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.⁹ Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him!

The Gospel Reading: John 8:48-59

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 8th chapter.

Congregation: Glory to You, O Lord!

48 The Jews answered him, “Aren’t we right in saying that you are a Samaritan and demon-possessed?” **49** “I am not possessed by a demon,” said Jesus, “but I honor my Father and you dishonor me.

50 I am not seeking glory for myself; but there is one who seeks it, and he is the judge. **51** Very truly I tell you, whoever obeys my word will never see death.” **52** At this they exclaimed, “Now we know that you are demon-possessed! Abraham died and so did the prophets, yet you say that whoever obeys your word will never taste death. **53** Are you greater than our father Abraham? He died, and so did the prophets. Who do you think you are?” **54** Jesus replied, “If I glorify myself, my glory means nothing. My Father, whom you claim as your God, is the one who glorifies me.

55 Though you do not know him, I know him. If I said I did not, I would be a liar like you, but I do know him and obey his word.

56 Your father Abraham rejoiced at the thought of seeing my day; he saw it and was glad.” **57** “You are not yet fifty years old,” they said to him, “and you have seen Abraham!” **58** “Very truly I tell you,” Jesus answered, “before Abraham was born, I am!” **59** At this, they picked up stones to stone him, but Jesus hid himself, slipping away from the temple grounds.


