The First Lesson: Proverbs 3:31-35; 11:1-3 (NRSVA)

³¹ Do not envy the violent and do not choose any of their ways;
³² for the perverse are an abomination to the LORD, but the upright are in his confidence. ³³ The LORD’s curse is on the house of the wicked, but he blesses the abode of the righteous.
³⁴ Towards the scorners he is scornful, but to the humble he shows favour. ³⁵ The wise will inherit honour, but stubborn fools, disgrace.

¹ A false balance is an abomination to the LORD, but an accurate weight is his delight. ² When pride comes, then comes disgrace; but wisdom is with the humble. ³ The integrity of the upright guides them, but the crookedness of the treacherous destroys them.

¹ So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God.

² Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, ³ for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

¹² As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience.

The Gospel Lesson: Luke 14:1-14 (NRSVA)

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the 14th chapter.

Congregation: Glory to You, O Lord.

¹ On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely. ² Just then, in front of him, there was a man who had dropsy. ³ And Jesus asked the lawyers and Pharisees, 'Is it lawful to cure people on the sabbath, or not?'

⁴ But they were silent. So Jesus took him and healed him, and sent him away. ⁵ Then he said to them, ‘If one of you has a child or an ox that has fallen into a well, will you not immediately pull it out on a sabbath day?’ ⁶ And they could not reply to this. ⁷ When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honour, he told them a parable. ⁸ ‘When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honour, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; ⁹ and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, “Give this person your place”, and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. ¹⁰ But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, “Friend, move up higher”; then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. ¹¹ For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.’ ¹² He said also to the one who had invited him, ‘When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbours, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. ¹³ But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. ¹⁴ And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.’
